Add the green valleys, sheer cliffs and wide open landscapes and you have a MUST-SEE destination. But that's not all. We'll see Copenhagen, rural Denmark, interior Sweden and end with two nights in Stockholm. It will be an unforgettable journey that we promise you'll enjoy.

Because of its beauty, it isn't cheap to travel in Scandinavia. We have included what we think you must see. We could have saved several hundred dollars by cutting out Geiranger Fjord – but what a shame that would be as it is one of Norway's most dramatic and beautiful fjords. We have also included in the itinerary many activities that other tour companies would "sell" once you are over there. We promise you that it is worth the investment. So read on. We think you'll like what you see. We look forward to hosting you to beautiful SCANDINAVIA!

Daily Itinerary

July 21, 2010: Today we board our flight for lovely Copenhagen, Denmark, arriving the following morning.

July 22: Upon arrival, we'll transfer to our hotel for a brief rest. During the afternoon, we'll take a stroll through the heart of the city with a visit to the Church of our Lady which is home to the original Christus Statue by Torvaldsen. We'll stop at the nearby "Round Tower" built by King Christian IV in 1637. The views from the top are stunning. We will meet our local tour manager this evening.

July 23: After breakfast this morning, we enjoy a guided sightseeing tour of Copenhagen which reveals impressive sights such as the renaissance Stock Exchange, Christiansborg Palace and the Little Mermaid – the statue inspired by Hans Christian Andersen's fairytale. In the afternoon, you'll have some time to relax or take an optional tour. This evening, we have included tickets to visit Tivoli Gardens, Copenhagen's famous entertainment/amusement park. There are fun stage shows, beautiful gardens, unique ambiance and great food. It is a cultural must in Copenhagen. (Breakfast)

July 24: After breakfast this morning, we head west and cross the bridge to the Island of Funen and the town of Odense, Hans Christian Andersen's birthplace. The peaceful rural setting is typical of the Danish countryside. We'll enjoy lunch in town. From here we will cross to the Jutland Peninsula en route to Aalborg, a charming mixture of old and new, for dinner and overnight stay. (Scandinavian breakfast / Dinner)

July 25: We'll get an early start today as we head to Hirsthals, at the north end of the peninsula where we board our ship to cross the Skagerrak to the port of Kristiansand in Norway. After we disembark we join our coach and drive via Mandal and Flekkefjord to Stavanger, one of Norway's oldest towns. (Scandinavian breakfast / Dinner)

July 26: After breakfast we enjoy an amazing journey today as we island-hop from Stavanger to the capital of the Fjords, Bergen. On this coastal highway we cruise fjords and pass islands on this spectacular coastline. We enjoy a scenic ferry ride from Mortavika to Arsvagen, then from Sandvikvag to Halhjem. In the early afternoon, we arrive in beautiful Bergen, flanked by fjords and enjoying a spectacular natural setting. We'll enjoy an orientation tour upon arrival. We will enjoy views of the 13th century Haakons Hall and stroll through the bustling fish market. (Scandinavian breakfast)

July 27: We spend the day in Bergen today. We have included an excursion this morning called Music and Mountains. We'll first visit the picturesque home of Norway's most famous composer, Edvard Grieg, with its underground symphony hall. This is followed by a cable car trip up Mt Floyen, Bergen's highest elevation, affording breathtaking views of the city and the surrounding fjord region. You'll have some free time for shopping in the afternoon. (Scandinavian breakfast)

July 28: Today we continue living in postcards. The beauty that we'll enjoy today cannot be explained on paper. We will first travel to the ski resort of Voss where we take a train for a journey that will take us 3,000 feet above sea level. We'll have time at the top to admire the scenery before taking the famous Flam railway – one of the most exciting railway journeys in the world! We will enjoy spectacular views of mountains and waterfalls before crossing over the deep and magnificent waters of Sognefjord to our hotel in scenic Leikanger. Believe me, you will pinch yourself as you gaze at this unbelievable scene. (Scandinavian breakfast / Dinner)

July 29: Today we continue our journey to the north in this incredible fjordland. Our morning drive will take us along the spectacular Sognefjord, the longest in all of Norway. We continue onwards through breathtaking glacier country. In the afternoon, we begin to see views of Geirangerfjord as we descend to the picturesque little town of Geiranger. (Scandinavian breakfast / Dinner)

July 30: We have a full day to enjoy the dramatic scenery of this area. Our coach will take us on a steep climb to the Eagles' Road for amazing views of the Geiranger Fjord. Then onward to the 'path of the trolls' - Trollstigen, considered a masterpiece of engineering. This is Norwegian rugged mountain scenery at its finest. The combination of mountains and fjords and waterfalls makes these some of the greatest views in all of Norway – and thus, all of Europe! We then return to our same hotel in Geiranger. (Scandinavian breakfast / Dinner)

July 31: Today the breathtaking views continue as we drive out of Geiranger. Then along Ottadalen we stop to visit the traditional Stave Church at Lom. A Stave Church represents the intersection between the Viking religions and Christianity and they are a site to see. From here we continue through the fertile Gudbrandsdal Valley, inspiration for Ibsen's 'Peer Gynt', and into Lillehammer, home of the 1994 Winter Olympics. We'll spend the night here. Before dinner at the hotel you'll have the option to visit the open-air museum at Maihaugan (Scandinavian breakfast / Dinner)

August 1: Our first highlight this morning is the lakeside Hamar. Here we view the unusual ice rink built for the Olympics before making our way to Norway's capital, Oslo. On our arrival a guided sightseeing tour highlights the medieval fortress of Akershus, the Royal Palace and a visit to the Vigeland Sculpture Park. This afternoon, we have included entrance fees into the interesting Viking Museum in Oslo which is a must. You'll see the Kon-Tiki raft and some very old Viking ships that have been preserved. (Scandinavian breakfast)

August 2: Today we travel across the border into Sweden. The countryside is delightful with thick woods and rolling hills. We continue via Karlstad on beautiful Lake Vänern, past the city of Orebro and into the island-ringed capital, Stockholm for our two-night stay. Stockholm is set on 14 islands and enjoys a unique setting for a European capital. Before going to the hotel, we'll show you a "Hidden Treasure" in this city of contrasts. (Scandinavian breakfast)

August 3: The charms of this city are revealed on our morning sightseeing tour with a local guide. We'll see the medieval Storkyrkan, Riddarholm church, the Royal Palace, plus a visit to the waterside City Hall where the Nobel Prize banquets are held. After lunch, we have included entrance into the famous Vasa Museum showcasing the oldest fully preserved war ship in the world. It sunk outside of Stockholm in the 1600's and was discovered about 50 years ago in a fully preserved state. It is a fascinating look into life in the 17th century. Tonight, we enjoy a farewell dinner together. (Scandinavian breakfast / Farewell dinner)

August 4: Today we transfer to the airport for flights home. You will have seen one of the world's great travel destinations.

This tour is organized by Webb Tours based on many trips to the region. The hotels, transportation and local guides are provided by Trafalgar Tours, Europe. That is the case because they have excellent hotels at reasonable prices. Their local Tour Manager will provide interesting information as we travel to enhance your experience.

Registration Information:

To make a reservation, simply **fill out the attached reservation form and send it to us with a deposit of \$400 per person.** When we receive your deposit, we will mail you a receipt confirming that you are registered for the tour. A letter with instructions, hotel itinerary flight information (if applicable) and luggage tags will be sent 90 days prior to departure at which time the balance will be due. You do not need to pay the balance until after you receive that packet. We require final payments in the form of a check. If that is not possible, arrangements can be made to use a credit card. Webb Tours accepts Visa, Mastercard and Discover. A 2% surcharge will be added for credit card payments.

Cancellation Penalties

We understand that you may need to cancel your trip for whatever reason. If it is 95 days or more before departure, all money will be refunded. If it is within 95 days, the following schedule applies

95 – 46 days prior	\$200 per person + insurance + any applicable airline fees
45 – 22 days prior	25% of total cost + insurance + any applicable airline fees
21 – 8 days prior	30% of total cost + insurance + any applicable airline fees
7 – 1 days prior	50% of total cost + insurance + any applicable airline fees
Day of departure	100% of total cost + insurance + any applicable airline fees

For airlines, specifically, tickets are generally non refundable when purchased. However, most airlines will allow the value of the canceled tickets to be reused for future travel, though a penalty may be assessed to reuse the tickets. If you have to cancel, Webb Tours will work with other providers to obtain as much refund as possible for our travelers. Our travelers know us to be very fair in this regard.

Cancellation Insurance:

To avoid cancellation penalties, cancellation insurance may be purchased. Insurance will reimburse you for the non-refundable cancellation penalties imposed if you must cancel your trip for a covered reason like illness, injury or death to you, a traveling companion or an immediate family member. Other reasons for cancellation include Common Carrier-caused delays due to inclement weather, jury duty, or a documented traffic accident en route to departure.

The per person price for insurance for this tour is \$199

If you are interested in the insurance, it is best to purchase it when your deposit is made as all preexisting conditions are waived. However, insurance may be purchased any time up to the point you make your final payment. Insurance cannot be purchased after your final payment is made. Webb Tours is not the insurer and acts as agent for the insurance company. To activate your insurance, we need your premium and your birth date. **Travel insurance also includes \$2,500 for baggage loss, \$500 for baggage delay, up to \$50,000 for medical expenses and up to \$50,000 for medical evacuation.**

Currency Fluctuation:

Webb Tours reserves the right to adjust the rates if necessary in order to reflect currency fluctuations larger than 10% from those used in our tour price. This is not likely to happen, but we must protect against it. A shift of that magnitude would quickly erase our tour profits. Of course, if the fluctuation moves in the opposite direction, we will reduce your tour price.
